DIRECTIONS to Bremer Conference:

From the Campus Inn, head to the intersection on your left, which is Huron and State. Cross Huron and walk south on State to the third intersection past Huron. At North University, cross State and walk down the sidewalk that cuts diagonally toward the center of the Quad and the Library. You pass between two widely separated buildings (Natural Science and Mason Hall). Turn right onto the next sidewalk and take it to the entrance in the center of the building which is covered by a metallic canopy. This is the main entrance between Haven and Mason Halls.

Enter at the main entrance facing the Diag and Library; Mason Hall is to your right and Haven Hall to your left. The elevators for Haven Hall are a short walk to your left. Take the elevator to the fifth floor. Upon exiting, take the corridor to the right all the way to the end of the building. You will see a room enclosed with interior windows; this is the Eldersveld Room.
